



1 Designer pieces sit in harmony in this corner of Fabrice and Jean-Eric's home. The relaxed silhouette of the black 'AA' Butterfly chair from Airborne balances out the dramatic photographic print by Bruno Campagnie titled *Fatou*, while the Normann Copenhagen oak coat rack nods to the finish of the timber side table. Wine storage bottles in coloured glass are common in the nearby region of Bordeaux, and here they have found new life as decorative elements that help bounce the sunshine filtering through a sleek recessed window.

Tip: Stick to a loose colour and material palette for a cohesive feel and balance when combining old and new feature pieces.

2 To make the most of the natural light in the cabin, interior designer Dominique Cha had the floors and walls painted in white. She chose the same white paint for the exposed rafters, highlighting the structural beauty of the original shed while tying it into the modern look of the updated space. A geometric-patterned black-and-white runner marks out the kitchen zone and creates a dynamic focal point in the mostly monochrome scheme.

Tip: Add depth and interest to an all-white room with a contrasting focal point. Here it's a rug, but you could try a large artwork or an upholstered armchair in a bold tone.
